Professional Purse Paid: \$24,200

Notes: Temperature at the start (65°) second "coolest" in last six years (55 °: 2015) ... **Gabriel Geay** is the first Tanzanian to win the Boulder, doing so in a 29:02.19 time, the 18th-fastest winning time in Boulder annals (but the fastest since 2009 and third fastest since 2003) ... Last year's winner, Kenya's **Isaac Mukundi**, finished in 14th in 30:19.30 (about 68 seconds slower than his winning time of 29:12.14 last year).

2017 WOMEN'S PROFESSIONAL RESULTS

Location: Boulder, Colo.

Distance: 10K

Date: May 29, 2017

Weather (11:12 a.m.): 65 degrees, 41% humidity, partly cloudy skies, winds from the southwest at 1 mph

Professional Purse Paid (Not Including Team): \$17,800

Notes: Temperature at the start (65°) second "coolest" in last six years (55°: 2015) ... Ethiopia's **Mamitu Daska** overtook teammate Ruti Aga near the end of the fifth mile to win the BolderBOULDER for the fifth time; she previously won in 2009, 2010, 2012 and 2014 ... She ties **Rosa Mota** for the most wins in race history (either gender); Mota won in 1984, 1985, 1986, 1988 and 1990 ... This was the sixth straight win by an Ethiopian woman (and eighth in the last nine—four different Ethiopian women have won in this time frame) ... Her time of 32:44.84 in the seventh-fastest winning time in Bolder history (third fastest by an Ethiopian).

Professional Purse Paid: \$135,500 (*men \$72,000; women \$63,500*)

Notes: The **United States** men won for the first time, doing so in the third-closest team race in the 13 years of the International Challenge (Ethiopia and Kenya traded 1-point wins in 2011 and 2013) ... The **Ethiopian** women won for the ninth time (eighth time in nine years—finished second last year); it was the closest race in the women's history, in 2011, Ethiopia defeated the U.S., 17-19 ... Kenya's 24 points in third place was the second lowest third-place total in 13 races ... Both U.S.A. teams (men and women) were scored as follows: first three finishers comprised the "Red" team; the second three the "White" team and the final three the "Blue" team.

Weather (6:50 a.m.): 51 degrees, 75% humidity, clear skies, winds from the northeast at 1 mph

Professional Purse Paid: \$5,000

Notes: Aaron Pike won his second BolderBOULDER, as he claimed the 2011 title in 23:49; he won this year in 23:45.20. He won by 1 second back in '11; his margin of victory this year (2:26.41) was the largest since 2004 ... **Cheri Madsen** claimed her second title in a row (after finishing third, fourth and third the previous three years); she was about 25 seconds behind her winning time of 27:47.87 last year ... Last year's men's champion, **Jose Jimenez**, finished second in 26:11.61 (he won in 25:43.46 in 2016) ... The weather at the start was almost identical to a year ago (same temperature, humidity last year was 68%, wind negligible).

Notes: **Barnabas Kosgei**, an accomplished international runner, made some history today: his 42-second margin of victory was the largest in the Citizens/BolderBOULDER portion of the race since 1995 when the record was set (53 seconds: John Mirth 30:40, Tim Jones 31:33) ... Kosgei's last five splits were under 5 minutes; after his "slowest" mile (1, 5:07), he followed it with by 4:50, 4:48, 4:46, 4:37 (fastest split in the field) and 4:49 (he actually ran in 29:44 in his chip time, but started late accounting for the other 16 seconds) ... Last year's winner, **Brandon Johnson** finished second in 30:43; he ran 30:34 in 2016 (he had five sub-5 minute splits) ... Last year's runner-up **Ian Butler** finished sixth in 31:07 (he was second in 30:18 in '16) ... This year's top 10 men all finished sub 31:51; last year 10th place was 32:28 ... **Lauren Martin** (Alamosa) was the first female finisher in 34:55, which placed her 105th overall; her time was some 49 seconds faster than the winning time a year ago (35:44 by Melissa Dock); her fastest split was 5:27 for mile 5, the fastest in the field, as was her splits for the second, third, fourth and sixth miles (Sarah Inglis had the fastest opening split of 5:32).
