Professional Purse Paid: \$24,000

Notes: Getaneh Tamire won in the fourth-fastest time in race history, a sizzling 28:18 ... Last year's winner, **Gabriel Geay**, sliced 23 seconds off his winning time of 29:03 last year with his 28:39 time the 14th-fastest; **Hassan El Assassi's** time of 28:44 also cracked the top 20 at No. 18; only 1995 (seven) had more sub-29:00 times than this year's six (there were five in 2008) ... A record 13 time bonuses were paid out (\$19,250 between the men and women, topping the old high of \$17,500 in 2008).

Weather (11:15 a.m.): 64 degrees, 64% humidity, cloudy skies, winds from the north at 5 mph (gusting to 15)

Professional Purse Paid (Not Including Team): \$22,300

Notes: Ethiopia's **Mamitu Daska** pulled away in mile 6 from the USA's **Aliphine Tuliamuk** to win her sixth BolderBOULDER and second in a row; she previously won in 2009, 2010, 2012, 2014 and 2017 ... In winning her sixth, she broke a tie with **Rosa Mota** for the most wins in race history (either gender); Mota, who was in town for the Legends ceremony, won in 1984, 1985, 1986, 1988 and 1990 ... This was the seventh straight win by an Ethiopian woman (and ninth in the last 10—four different Ethiopian women have won in this time frame) ... Her time of 32:36 was nine seconds faster than last year, is the sixth-fastest winning time in Bolder history (she owns six of the top 11 times overall).

Professional Purse Paid: \$115,000 (*men \$49,500; women \$67,000*)

Notes: The **Ethiopia** men won for the ninth time in 21 International Team competitions (first since 2015), winning by eight points, tied for the largest margin since 2012 and the fourth-largest point difference overall ... The **Ethiopian** women won for the 12th time (ninth in the last 10 years—finished second in 2016); it was the fourth time the winning margin (10 points) was in double0digits (15 in 2009, 12 in 2012, 13 in 2015) ... Both U.S.A. teams (men and women) were scored as follows: first three finishers comprised the “Red” team; the second three the “White” team and the final three the “Blue” team.

Weather (6:55 a.m.): 59 degrees, 72% humidity, mostly cloudy, winds from the north at 2-3 mph

Professional Purse Paid: \$5,000

Notes: Aaron Pike won his third BolderBOULDER to go with his previous wins last year (23:45) and in 2011 (in 23:49) ... He again won in convincing fashion, by over 2 minutes and 2 seconds (2:02.81); he won by 1 second back in '11 and by 2:26.41 last year, which was the largest since 2004 ... It was the fastest winning time since 2005, when Saul Mendoza blitzed the course in 20:40 ... **Jose Jimenez**, the 2016 champion, finished for the second straight year ... **Amanda McGrory** returned to the winner's circle in claiming her third BolderBOULDER crown, to go with titles in 2014 and 2015; it was her fastest time as champion (26:59 in 2014, 27:08 in 2015), and with was the best women's clocking since 2013 when Susannah Scaroni won in 26:06 ... **Cheri Madsen** had won the last two years and settled for second; she has five top three finishes in the last six Bolders.

Notes: Tyler McCandless gradually pulled away from field about halfway through the race and cinched it by running the only-sub 5-minute split for miles three-through-six with a blazing 4:52 for mile 5 ... That was actually his fastest mile, as his others were 4:54 (mile 1), 4:59 (mile 2), 5:01 (mile 3), 5:00 (mile 4) and 5:02 (mile 6) ... The one-time All-American from Penn State ('10, meteorology major) finished fourth last year in 31:04.10 and sixth in 2016 (32:06) ... The next nine in the top 10, if they raced a year ago, were all outside of it in 2017 ... **Connor Winter** was second, 26 seconds back, as the CU graduate ('16, mechanical engineering) and former school distance performer moved into the runner-up spot early in mile 5 and hung on ... Another former Buff, **Clint Wells**, was the only person 40 or older in the top 50 (he is 43 and placed 10th) ... **Melissa Dock** of Boulder captured her second Bolder; she won in 2016 in a 35:44 time (she was also second in 2014).
